The good news is that the meeting room at the Holiday inn in Elmhurst is much cooler, but the bad news is that the excellent buffet that we enjoyed at the has been nixed by the hotel management. So if you want a hot dinner you need to go out to eat.

After a splash in the pool, Miranda, Stacey and myself wanted to go to dinner at the Elmhurst Public House, but it was closed because of it had no power. So after some debate we went to the Kopper Kitchen at St.Charles Road and kingery hwy. just down the street from the holiday inn.

Be fore warned this is a family restaurant and there may be family there. The atmosphere was nice. we were seated in the main dinning room. I noticed only a few looks from the other patrons but so what if they look.

Being on diets we all has the soup and salad, Miranda had a mexican salad, Stacey had the cobb salad, and I had the chicken ceasers salad. We all had the french onion soup, there were two others available but the french onion is always available. When the salads arrived we were surprised by the large size they were big. Stack even asked for a take home box for later. Miranda and I managed to make it through though.

This restaurant seems to serve large portions on many of its dishes. At an adjoining table another patron ordered the prime rib. The steak was the biggest I have ever seen for this cut it seemed bigger than a double cut.

PICNIC

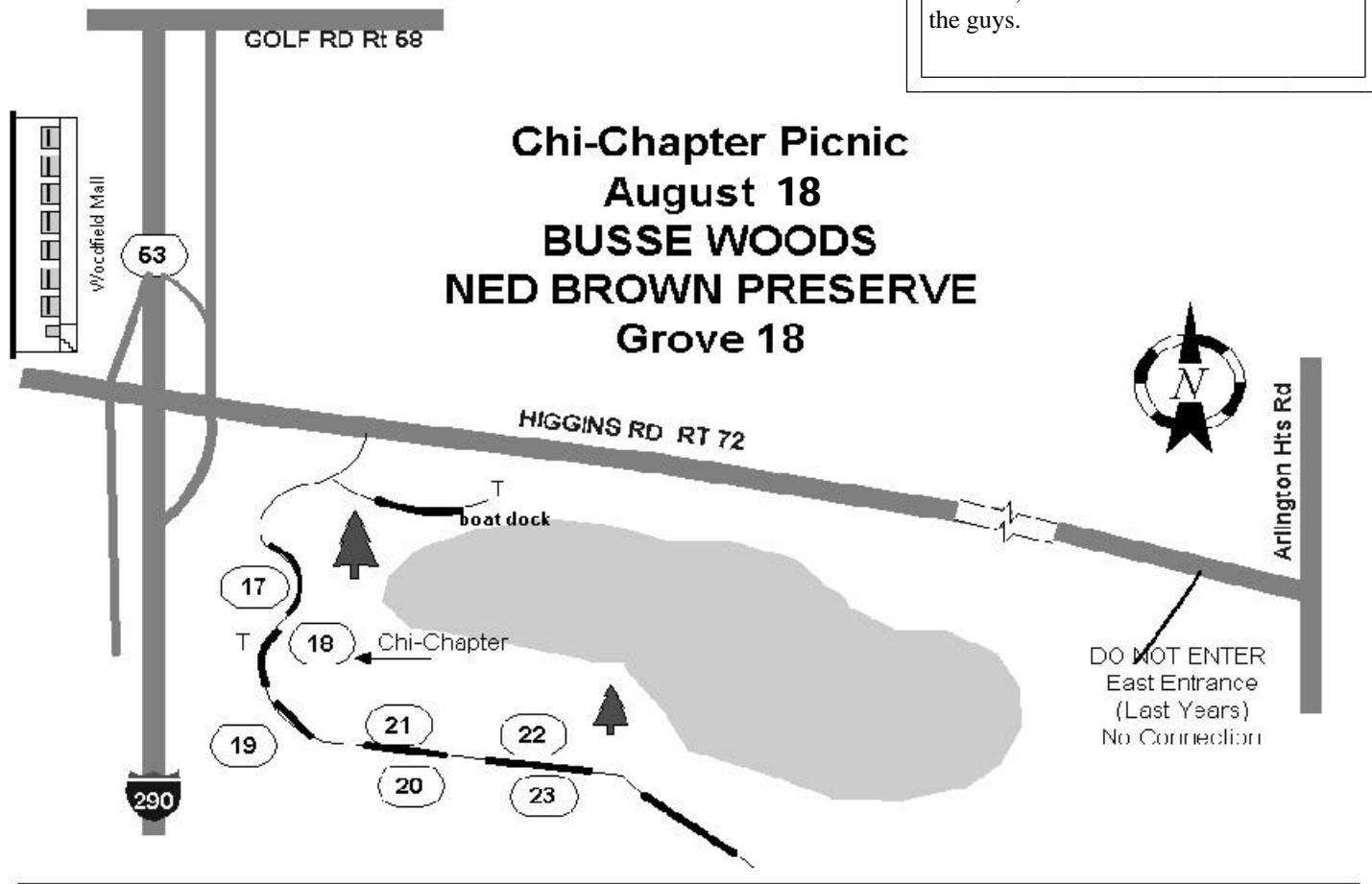

Proper picnic attire is required for all — SORRY, NO CROSSDRESSING for the guys.





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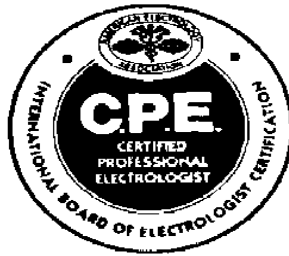


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
