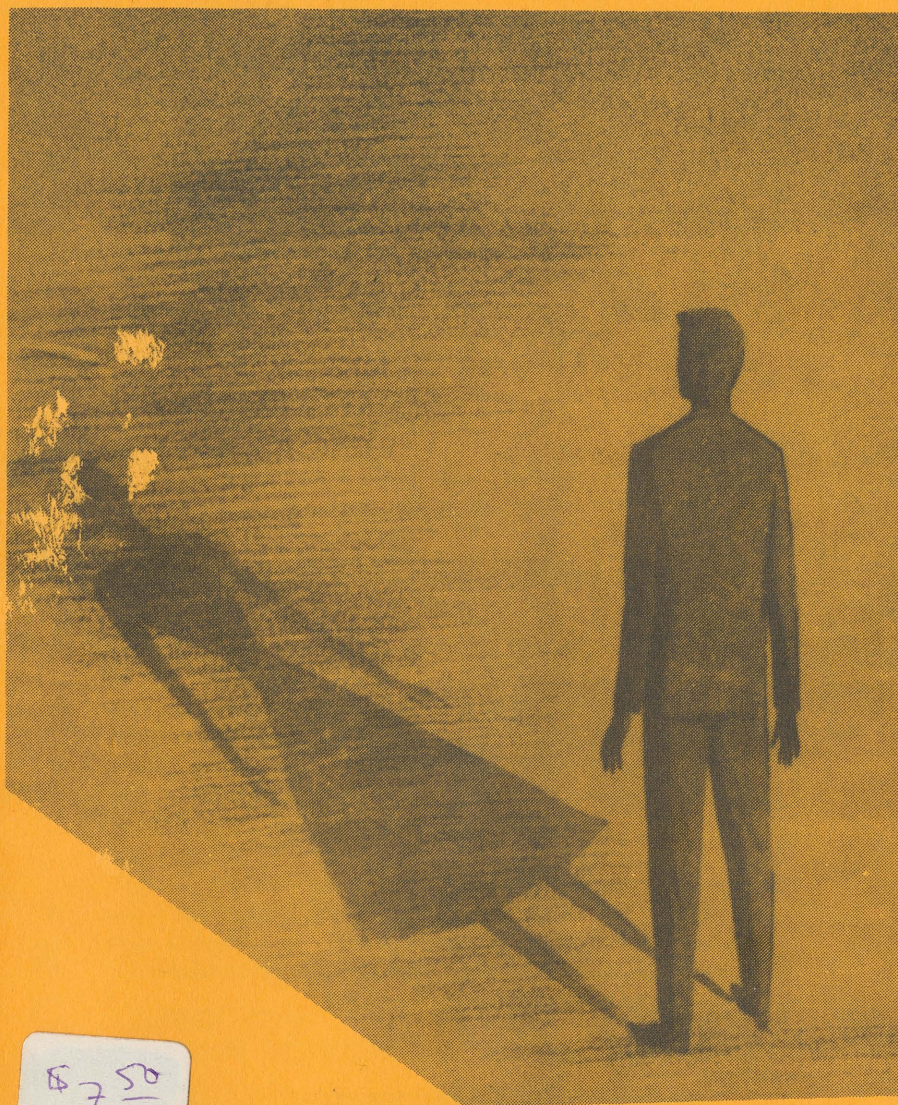

I Androgyny

Gender, an Ethnomethodological Approach by S. Kessler

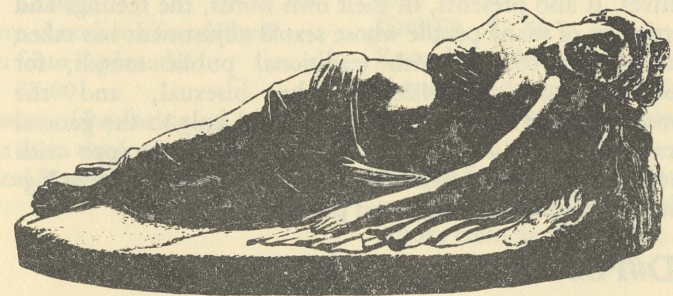
Is deciding whether someone is female or male a matter of simple inspection? If not, then what is the process of gender attribution and what does it reveal about the social construction of gender in our society?

This book, one of the first to apply ethnomethodology to the study of a specific content area, critically reviews traditional scientific work on the biology and psychology of gender and demonstrates how scientific treatment is grounded in the everyday gender attribution process. They suggest that gender is a social construction independent of objective criteria.

This unusual and provocative study focuses on challenges to commonsense ideas about gender: the phenomenon of transsexualism, some ideas that children have about gender, and the treatment of gender in other cultures.

It will appeal to professionals and advanced students in social and behavioral sciences who are concerned with gender, with the social construction of reality, or with the interface between them. The book stimulates new ways of thinking about gender and can lead to innovative methods of studying and interpreting what it means to be female or male.

Towards a Recognition of Androgyny by C. Heilbrun

Heilbrun believes that our future salvation lies in a movement away from sexual polarization and the prison of gender toward a world in which individual roles and the modes of personal behavior can be freely chosen. The ideal toward which she believes that we should move is best described by the term "Androgyny." This ancient Greek word—from 'andro' (male) and 'gyn' (female)—defines a condition under which the characteristics of the sexes, and the human impulses expressed by men and women, are not rigidly assigned. Androgyny seeks to liberate the individual from the confines of the appropriate.

Heilbrun's method is to use the vast world of myth and literature as a universe in which to seek out the signs of androgyny. This book is an interesting, lively, and valuable general introduction to a new way of perceiving our Western cultural traditions.

Masculinity and Femininity by G. Henry

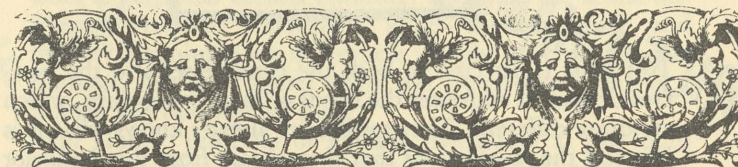
A classic study of sex variants based on 9,000 case studies, this book considers the extent to which every man possesses feminine attributes and every woman is, in some respects, masculine. Based on over thirty years of psychiatric clinical research and observations, this book considers the causes and symptoms of sexual deviation—heredity and environment, constitutional predisposition, impotence, frigidity, and fantasies. It examines the personality development of the male and female from childhood to old age, pointing out the many ways in which human beings adjust to their internal sexual drives. It also presents, in their own words, the feelings and attitudes of many people whose sexual adjustment has taken forms that conflict with traditional public morals, for example, the exhibitionist, the bisexual, and the homosexual. This book is addressed not only to the general reader but also to all who try to help people cope with personal problems—especially educators, lawyers, penologists, social workers, clergy, and parents.

The Feminine, Spacious as the Sky by M. & J. Arguelles

A major departure in the investigation of the feminine principle, this book transcends the psychological and social views that previously have been voiced. Here, the feminine is not applicable to women alone, but is relevant to both men and women in their search for self-understanding. The book draws on a number of spiritual and cultural traditions, re-evaluating their insights to produce a synthesis that sheds new light on the meaning of the feminine and how it penetrates everyday life experiences. The masculine principle, as it relates to the feminine, is also investigated to show how the interplay between the feminine and the masculine is a dance illuminating the spiritual and cultural development of humanity. The numerous illustrations throughout the book lend strong visual impact and what the text reveals about the feminine, "unborn, unceasing, and spacious as the sky."

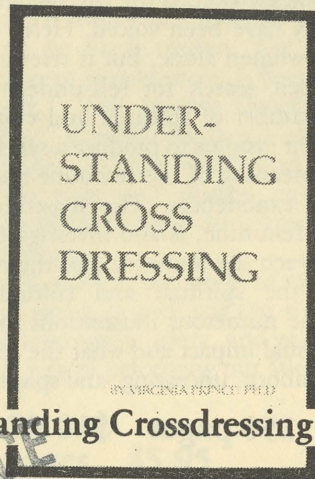

Understanding Crossdressing by V. Prince

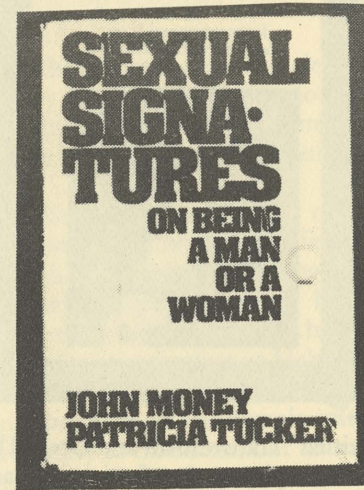
This book is directed to both the crossdresser and the non-crossdresser. It addresses the needs of these two groups, which are quite different. The crossdresser already knows what it is like and the satisfactions that they obtain from that behavior pattern, but in many cases they do not understand why they do it. Many crossdressers think that they are the only ones that do it and have a need to understand themselves and become aware of the vast number of other individuals who do exactly the same thing.

The non-crossdresser has a need to understand a behavior pattern exhibited by others, especially wives, parents, counsellors, psychologists, psychiatrists, judges, teachers, and just friends of someone who crossdresses. They need information such as this book presents to help them deal with their own feelings and to be helpful to the person.

In this book, Dr. Prince provides a great deal of insight into the questions of gender, the relationship between sex roles and gender roles, and the 'girl within' concept. There are chapters dealing with liberation for the crossdresser, hormones and surgery, and changing one's sex or gender or both. It is a valuable analysis from an experienced expert on this behavior pattern that is directed at both the general reader and professionals.

Sexual Signatures by J. Money & P. Tucker



What makes a man or a woman? Certain physical characteristics or particular mental attitudes? What are the actual differences—cultural stereotypes aside—between male and female? Examining sex differences in light of recent pioneer findings, this book shows where you are now as a man or a woman and how you got there.

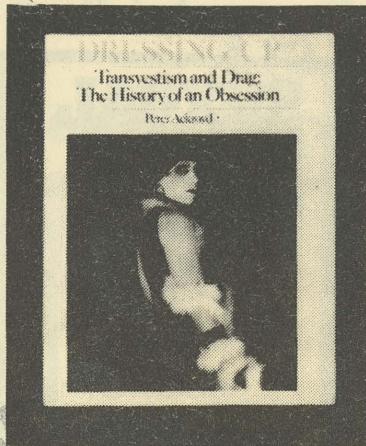
John Money, professor of medical psychology at the Johns Hopkins University and Hospital, has been researching 'gender identity'—your sense of yourself as male or female—in human beings for twenty-five years. This book distills the findings of his ground-breaking research for the general reader. Among other important issues, the book discusses the anatomical and biological factors that steer one toward masculinity and femininity, sorting them out from the historical, cultural, and sociological influences on each stage of a person's gender identity development.

The traditional assumption has been that just two possibilities exist at conception. But the exceptions—hermaphrodites, transsexuals, homosexuals, and bisexuals—have raised puzzling questions. In attempting to help these people fit comfortably into society's sexual schemas, scientists have arrived at startling discoveries: in fact, a person becomes male or female by stages, and there is a great deal more flexibility than is ordinarily supposed.

This book can help you find and keep your bearing in relation to your peers, your spouse, your parents, your children, and yourself. Filled with surprising facts and authoritative opinions, this book is bound to change the thinking and quite possibly the lives of all men and women who have been touched by these vital issues.

Dressing Up by P. Ackroyd



This book is subtitled 'Transvestism and Drag: The History of an Obsession'. It explores the fascinating and complex phenomena of Transvestism (crossdressing by heterosexuals who admire and identify with the opposite sex) and Drag (crossdressing by male homosexuals who adorn themselves in the highly exaggerated dress and makeup of the vamp in an expression of parody and misogyny). It is an examination of the profound psychological significance underlying most crossdressing: as an erotic experience; as the expression of longing for identification with women while maintaining one's maleness; and as fetishistic impulse. It is an exploration of the cultural and historical antecedents of this obsession which was (and in some cultures still is) an integral part of religious ritual and theatre—among American Indians, and African tribes, in the theatre of ancient Greece and Rome, and in the Noh and Kabuki theatre of Japan. Ackroyd discusses the depiction of transvestism and drag in literature and in contemporary cinema, music, dance and theater (including Marlene Dietrich, the cabaret, Chaplin, David Bowie, and the works of Visconti, among others) and considers famous Transvestites and drag artists (such as the Duke of Orleans, Queen Christina of Sweden, King Henry III of France, George Sand, Colette and others).

The author also notes the reactions of various societies throughout the centuries to the practice of crossdressing, ranging from acceptance and institutionalization to violent hostility. Accompanied by over 140 illustrations, this book is one of the few serious studies of transvestism and drag. It is a fascinating exploration of an enduring condition which alternately terrifies, reassures, alienates, and excites, and whose practice and mythology are as old as sex differentiation itself.

Transvestites and Transsexuals by D. Feinbloom

What are the differences between maleness and femaleness? Where do they come from? What do the clothes we wear symbolize? Why is it considered bizarre for a man to wear a dress while a woman can wear pants without inviting comment?

The author takes up these and other questions in her vivid inside report on the behavior and lifestyles of transvestites and transsexuals. Feinbloom, a sociologist and director of the Gender Identity Service in Boston, became interested in transvestism and transsexualism when her teaching colleague, Phil, was fired for crossdressing as Helen. Later Helen introduced Feinbloom to the local chapter of a transvestite sorority and to a number of male and female transsexuals who were not content simply to crossdress, but aimed, with the help of hormone treatments and surgery, to 'pass', even marry, as members of their biologically opposite sex. In her compassionate and compelling book, the author lets these men and women speak for themselves and shows how an understanding of deviant sexual behavior can illuminate our own everyday concepts of maleness and femaleness.

Regiment of Women by T. Berger

This novel is about Georgie Cornell, an attractive 29 year old secretary. Georgie goes to work dressed in tailored blouse, pleated skirt, and gas mask, dodges the advances of lecherous executives and worries about wrinkles and running mascara. Just like a secretary of today except that Georgie is a man. REGIMENT OF WOMEN is like nothing you have ever read. A shocking inversion of our contemporary struggle for sexual identity, a brutal and hilarious vision of erotic warfare, it is a book no reader will ever forget. Women rule supreme, dressed in business suits and stick-on beards. They violate the 'weaker sex', male. To propagate the species, men are drafted into State controlled sperm farms. This is a very exciting science fiction thriller whose theme is of particular interest to many of the paraculture.

A Year Among the Girls by D. Raynor

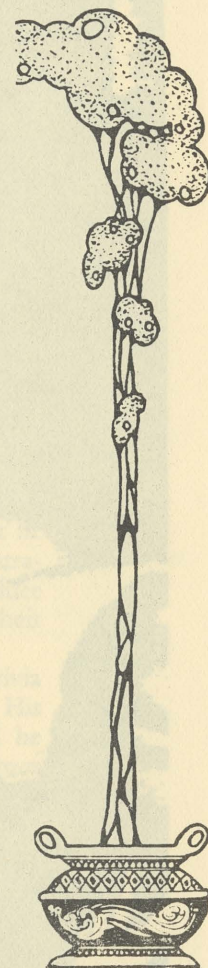
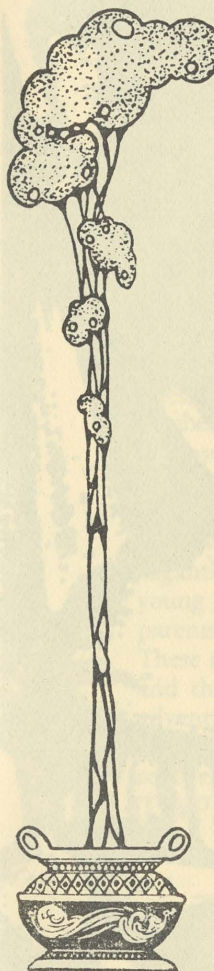
This book describes a cross-section of the male transvestites of America. They include virile men, beloved husbands and fathers, business leaders, engineers, and scientists, who spend their secret, leisure hours impersonating women. Himself gripped by the transvestite compulsion, the author explored for an entire year the psychology, the literature, the domestic and social lives of the male crossdressers of the United States. From New York to Los Angeles to small town America he probed the strange psychic forces that drive intelligent, sensitive men to their curious obsession. He attended the remarkable convention held on a secluded New York estate in 1962. In this book he suggests some startling answers to some of the questions that assail the reader: Is transvestism really becoming more prevalent?; How does the transvestite differ from the homosexual?; What is the classic pattern of suicide by youthful transvestites?; Can transvestism be cured?; What are the implications for the space program of the number of transvestite engineers?; Why is 'petticoat punishment' such a disastrous practice?; What is the legal attitude toward female impersonators?; Would a 'transvestites anonymous' society serve a useful purpose?; and How can a woman face the discovery that her husband likes to dress in women's clothing?

This is the first serious work on this topic and offers significant insights to psychologist and students of the social scene. It brings guidance and understanding to the individuals and families whose lives have been shadowed by the transvestite urge. It presents a picture of this little known phenomenon which will fascinate every reader who is involved in the idiosyncracies and problems of his fellow man.

The Transvestite Memoirs of the Abbe de Choisy

edited by R.H.F. Scott

These authentic memoirs are a remarkable document in the literature of transvestism. They provide a first-hand account of manners and morals in French society during the late seventeenth century.

Reared as a young girl by his ambitious mother, young Choisy was allowed to associate only with the nobility. Dressed in girl's clothes, his ears pierced for earrings and patches, he was much approved by 'Monsieur,' Louis XIV's homosexual and transvestite brother. At eighteen Choisy became a bachelor of theology and was given the abbacy of Saint Seine, but after his mother's death four years later he began to devote himself to transvestism, delighting in extravagantly feminine attire and using masquerade to seduce young girls, often with the unsuspecting connivance of their parents.

These memoirs reveal Choisy's quick eye for amusing trivia and the light, intimate style praised by Sainte-Beuve. His adventures, if scandalous, are always entertaining and he shows himself to be a likeable, vain, sensual, and generous seducer.

OUT OF PRINT

In the last 20 years, there has been a startling and rapid change in social attitudes towards so-called sexual problems. There has been a call for freedom to live in the style one chooses within the limits that one does no harm or interfere with the rights of others. The author, consultant clinical psychologist for Newcastle Hospital, presents this handbook with case studies for psychologists, psychiatrists, and counselors treating the theme of sex, gender identity, and gender role that rejects concepts of sexual perversion and deals with gender dysphoria. The author explains that transvestites rarely seek medical help. The unknown pool of adequately adjusted transvestites show that their 'ways' are wholly pleasurable and need cause no one distress. The author was given assistance by the Beaumont Society and its 500 transvestite members. His use of autobiography argues that it may be more profitable and nearer the truth to look for an understanding of the transvestite and transsexual as whole people characterized by the array of their talents and deficiencies rather than by the nature of their sexuality alone.

The Law and Transsexualism by J. Clark

This handbook for transsexuals attempts to answer many questions that they confront by reviewing existing case law, and administrative correspondence and decisions, providing answers in some areas but only producing additional questions to be answered in other areas. Joanna Clark is without a doubt one of the nation's most knowledgeable experts on this subject. In this legal primer for transsexuals she has clarified and compressed an astonishing amount of helpful information. From A (for Armed Forces) to V for vocational rehabilitation), you will find precisely the directions you need for the dozens of situations you may face in your daily living—changing your name, coping with discrimination on your job, handling yourself during a police investigation when you are cross dressed, just to mention a few.

Sex Change—The Achievement of Gender Identity Among Feminized Transsexuals by T. Kando

This book describes the post operative adjustment of 17 feminized transsexuals. The sex conversion operations took place as an experiment at the University of Minnesota in 1967 and 1968. The patients were interviewed in 1968 and 1969, and so were some of their friends and relatives. The resulting data are primarily documentary, although some are quantitative, tentatively testing some hypotheses. It is a sociological study of the social relations of transsexuals who have already undergone the sex change. The focus is on how the subjects get along now, what they do with their lives as newborn women, what methods they use to achieve their sexual identity.

Emergence—The Story of a F-M Sex Change by M. Martino

This book is only complete autobiography of a woman who has become a man. It is the astonishing true story of a person who has experienced sexuality in the body of both sexes.

This book is a pioneering journey across the sexual frontier described by a person whose determination and candor make it an illuminating event for any reader.

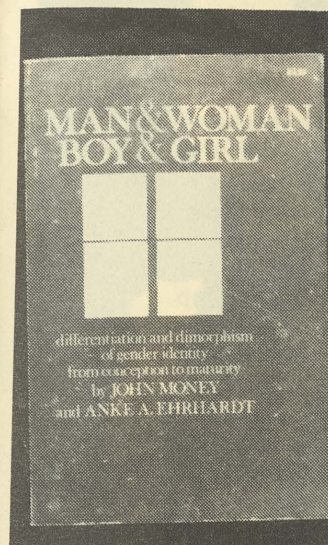

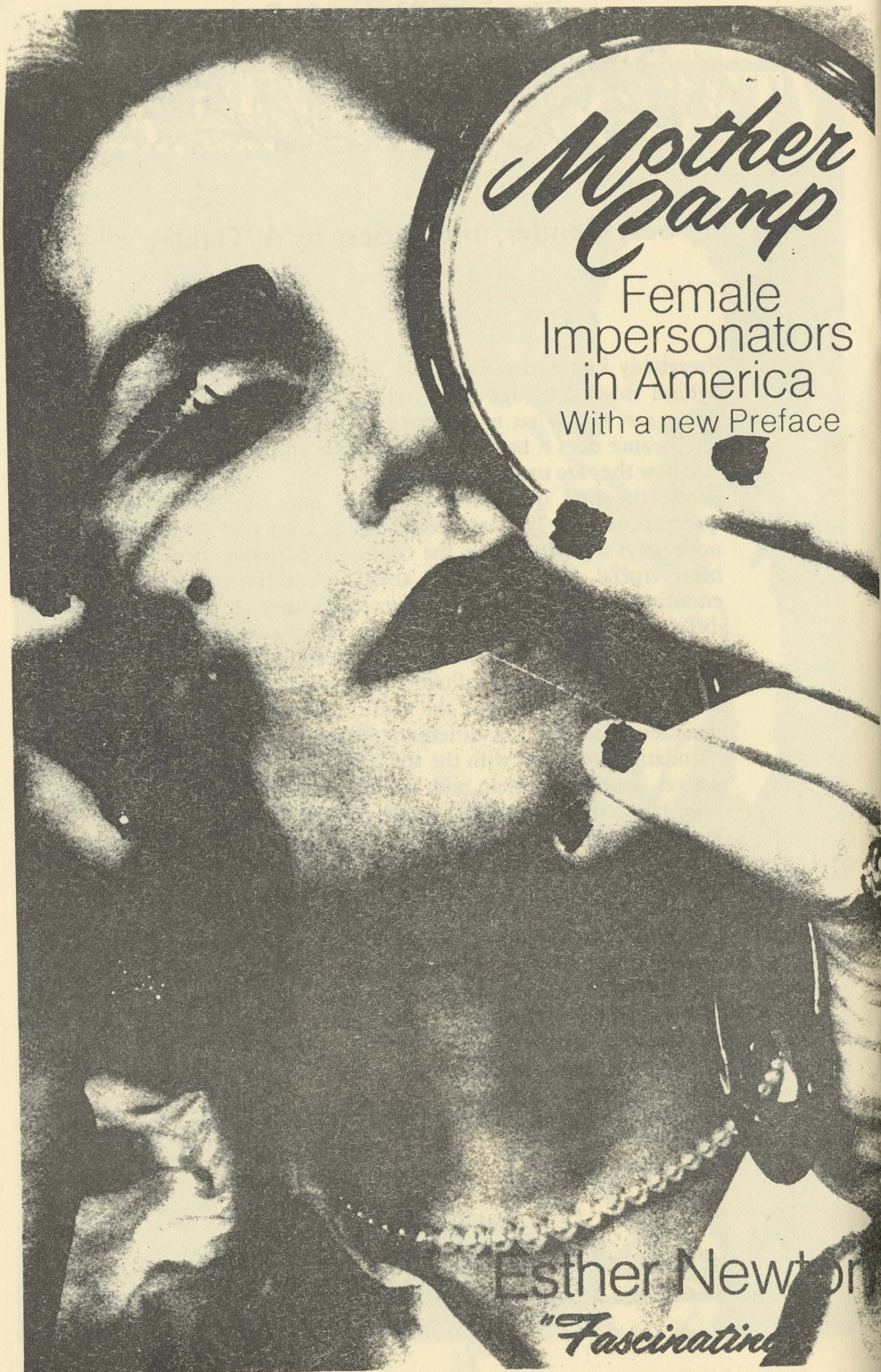
Sex, Gender, and Society by A. Oakley

Everybody knows that men and women are different. But behind this knowledge lies a certain uneasiness: How different are we? What is the extent of the difference? What significance does it have for the way male and female behave and how they are treated in society?

While the first questions are factual ones, the last is a question of value. In practice, of course, fact and value are not always separated, and the confusion between them has been crucial in the debate about sex differences. The enduring questions are these: does the source of the many differences between the sexes lie in biology or culture? If biology determines male and female roles, how does it determine them? How much influence does culture have? Mother Camp—Female Impersonators of America by E. Newton

For two years Esther Newton did field research in the world of drag queens—homosexual men who make a living impersonating women. He spent time in the noisy bars, the chaotic dressing rooms, and the cheap apartments and hotels that make up the lives of drag queens, interviewing informants whose trust he had earned, and compiling a lively, first hand ethnographic account of the culture of female impersonators.
