

## CARRIES DECEPTION EVEN TO HER WILL

Murray Hamilton Hall, Who Masqueraded as a Man, Provides for Headstone for "Deceased Wife."

NEW YORK, March 19.—Murray Hamilton Hall, who in life masqueraded as a man, associated with men, was politician and member of Tammany Hall and had been married to a woman for many years, but after death was found to be a woman, carried out her deception even to her will, in which reference is made to her deceased wife." The will, a short document, was filed to-day for probate. It reads as follows:

"I, Murray H. Hall of New York City, being of sound and disposing mind and considering the uncertainty of life, do make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, as follows, hereby revoking all other and former wills by me at any time made:

"First—After my lawful debts are paid I give, devise and bequeath all my property, both personal and real and wherever situated, to Imelda A. Hall, and especially request that at my death said Imelda A. Hall shall cause to be erected a suitable headstone over the grave of my deceased wife, Celia F. L. Hall."
