

THREE CHINESE GET IN.

One of the Number Is Chin Yi, a Female Impersonator, Who Has Come to Act.

Of the nine Chinese who were subjected to a rigid examination on the steamship City of Alexandria on Wednesday six remained last evening.

Among those permitted to land was the female impersonator Chin Yi. He was released on the statement of Chu Fong, manager of a Chinese theatre, who told Deputy Collector Gunner he had hired Chin Yi to act for two months at \$100 a month.

The other men released were Lan Tong Kow, who claimed to be a merchant at No. 32 Mott street, and Wang Sow Cheong, who said he was a merchant in Philadelphia, Pa. Both were identified by men who claimed to know them.

The two self-styled students were detained on board to await the assurances of some responsible person that they would not become charges on the community while continuing their studies.

The fate of the remaining four merchants is doubtful. Chinese Inspector Scharf had two special Treasury agents at work in the Chinese quarter yesterday trying to verify the statements of the men. They reported late in the day that the claims of all were fraudulent.

Inspector Scharf visited the British ship Glenogle, which reached this port from China yesterday with a cargo of tea. The ship is manned by thirty Chinese sailors; Inspector Scharf told the Captain the penalty if any of the sailors were landed would be \$500 for each man.
