Celebrating Family Diversity

Two very special programs at the IFGE convention

Renaissance is very pleased to announce the addition of two outstanding programs for the 1993 IFGE convention aimed at helping families deal with issues surrounding transgendered behavior.

The first of the two programs is *Cross-dressing and the Family: Coping With A Crossdressing Partner*. This is a hands-on workshop about communication and negotiation in a committed relationship for couples who still have issues about crossdressing in their relationship. While the focus is on couples, everyone is invited to attend the session.

Participants will be taken through written and verbal exercises designed to point out the similarities and differences in the way men and women communicate and negotiate issues. The group will then be led through a discussion of relevant issues and provided with tools and resources with which to develop communication and negotiation skills. A list of extremely useful publications will be provided. (These publications are available at Giovanni's Room, a bookstore within walking distance of the convention site.)

This program is scheduled for Friday, March 19, 2:00 - 3:20 PM.

The second program immediately follows the first. *Crossdressing and the Family: Children Coping With A Crossdressing Parent*: will focus on children's issues about a parent who is "different," specifically a crossdresser. Topics will include a discussion of a child's cognitive development, whether and when to tell a child, how to tell a child, what to tell a child, and what are the potential issues that might arise for the child immediately and in the future.

Included will be a list of reading resources that have been found useful with children in a "family of difference." (These publications are available at Giovanni's Room, a bookstore within walking distance of the convention site.)

The workshop leader for both programs is Carol Cobb-Nettleton (MS, DSW). Dr. Carol — as she is often called — is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker. She is a Clinical Family Consultant for chronically ill children and their families at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia.

She is also an Instructor in Medical/Ethical Decision Making.

Dr. Carol has worked with both transvestites and transsexuals, conducted Partner's Workshops for the spouses of transgendered people, and is a close friend and supporter of Renaissance.

In addition to these special programs, Dr. Carol will facilitate a panel discussion earlier in the day at 11:00 AM on establishing Effective Partners' Support Programs. Partners of people dealing with gender issues often need as much support and advice as the person themselves. Yet, it is often difficult to convince the partner that he/she should attend a Partners' Support meeting. This panel will discuss the various methods of organizing an effective Partners' Support Program, and working with Partners in a group setting. A Q&A period will follow the presentations. Panel participants will include Evelyn Kirkland (Renaissance), Linda Peacock (Sigma Epsilon Tri-Ess) and Cynthia Phillips (Bolton & Park).

ROGER'S NOTEBOOK

#76, by Roger E. Peo, Ph.D.

One of the ideas that has received a lot of attention during the past couple of years is the contention that a transgendered person is handicapped and therefore needs both specific protection under the law and perhaps also special considerations by society. This concern was heightened by recent and specific exclusion of transgendered persons from new laws enacted to protect people who are handicapped.

As I thought about this situation, I wondered just what "handicapped" really meant. My thesaurus lists a variety of synonyms for handicapped: afflicted, crippled, disabled, disadvantaged, hindered, impaired and maimed. Then I thought about the community's recent actions to get all the gender dysphoric definitions removed from the DSM-III-R. The contention is that transgendered persons are perfectly normal. To list their behaviors in a mental disorder classification was considered both improper and unfair. Now there seems to be a conflict here. Either being transgendered is a problem or it isn't! Obviously there is no answer to this conundrum.

In some cases, a transgendered person is handicapped by the feelings and behaviors that accompany this phenomenon. This handicap can take a variety of forms. Perhaps the most severe is when the feelings are so overwhelming that they interfere with day-to-day functioning. In such cases, I would describe the person as crippled or disabled. However, the solution is not a new law, but rather assistance for the person so that they can learn to manage their feelings. This is analogous to the therapy a person might receive after a physical injury.

However, there is a more subtle disadvantage that many handicapped face. This is often described as discrimination. Sometimes this discrimination is unintentional. It is caused by not recognizing the "hurdles" some people face because of their handicap. For example, wheelchair-bound people need ramps and lifts to allow them equal access to public facilities.

In a similar manner, persons known to be transgendered face social discrimination. For example, consider the ejection of post-surgical male-to-female transsexuals from the annual Womyn for Womyn Music Festival in Michigan. Even though transsexuals live a woman's lifestyle, they are not considered to be authentic women and so are barred from participation. Similarly, persons known to be transgendered can be evicted from housing simply for that fact even if they are model tenants.

Where does this leave the transgendered person? In a sense, they are handicapped by society's generally negative attitudes toward all sexual minorities. This leads to discrimination against them in a variety of overt and subtle ways. It is not clear to me that passage of new laws nor removal of transgender categories from the DSM will do much to change this situation. From my observations, it seems that the only workable strategy is education that will help the general public understand more about all aspects of human sexuality.

This course is long, tough and slow. It means putting yourself on the line in a variety of situations. Letters to the editor, pushing for appropriate sex-education in the schools, speaking out against all forms of discrimination and becoming active in social causes for other minorities can all be effective. Eliminating discrimination is not accomplished so much through legal remedies as through demonstrating to others that they need to be considerate of those who are different from themselves.

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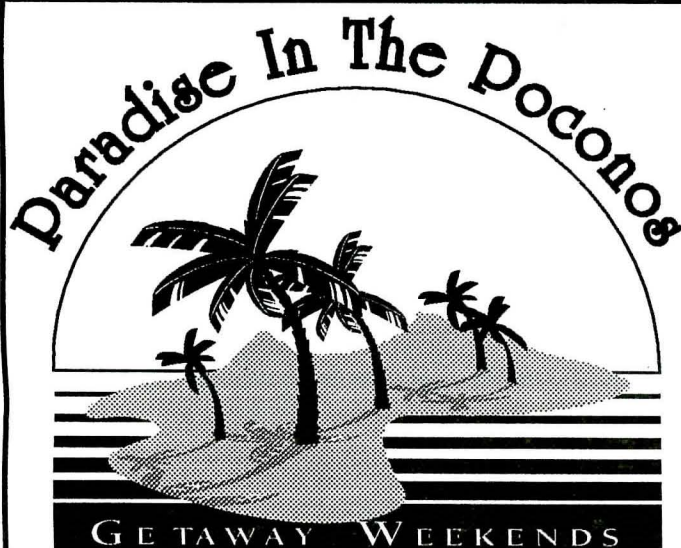

National Board Meets

The Renaissance National Board met on January tenth. In attendance were: Managing Director-Brenda Davidson, Treasurer-Joanne White, Co-chair of Outreach- Angela Gardner, GPC Leader- Maryann Kirkland, Co-chairs of Membership- Elsa Larson and Beth Marshall, South Jersey Chapter Rep.- Emily Sheldon, Librarian-Lee Etscovitz and at large member- JoAnn Roberts.

Joanne White submitted a nineteen ninety three National budget estimate of seven thousand eight hundred and eighty six dollars for expenses and eight thousand one hundred twenty five dollars in projected income. It was agreed that this was only an initial approximation and the board voted to approve the budget on a month-to-month basis.

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Warning Issued on Hormones

Feminizing and masculinizing hormones are necessary for most transsexual persons in order to live in the gender of choice. But they are not without risk and should never be taken without medical supervision.

Experimenting with hormones is illegal and can be dangerous. Black market preparations may be contaminated and may not be hormones at all. Even with the proper substances, overmedicating can cause a variety of debilitating and even fatal conditions; undermedicating may result in few, if any, of the desired physical changes. The type of medication, dosage, and route of administration are critical and can be regulated properly only by a physician.

Estrogens, the female hormones, are not magic bullets to grow breasts. Their effect is global. They will affect major bodily systems, including the emotions, the sex drive, and the ability to procreate. This is also true for androgens, the male hormones.

It is important that those who desire to be on hormones understand the physical changes which will occur over time and the effect those changes will have on their careers and on their relationships with others. To do this, the individual should explore his or her gender dysphoria with a psychiatrist, psychologist, or counselor prior to beginning hormone therapy.

Hormones should never be taken without an authorizing letter from a clinical behavioral scientist as defined by the "Standards of Care" of the Harry Benjamin International Gender Dysphoria Association, Inc., and then, only under the supervision of a physician who specializes in internal medicine or endocrinology, and who periodically monitors hormone patients' blood chemistries. It is critical that the individual be aware of the risks and benefits of the medications they are taking so that they can make informed decisions about them.

Those who are interested in learning more about the benefits and risks of hormones may read *Hormones* by Sheila Kirk, M.D. This book thoroughly discusses hormonal therapy in language the consumer can understand. It is available for \$9.50 postpaid from the International Foundation for Gender Education, P.O. Box 3657, Wayland, MA 01778.

Remember: Safeguard your heart and your life. With competent medical supervision, the risks from hormones are minimal.

A motion was made and approved that reimbursement requests for authorized expenses must be submitted to the treasurer within sixty days of the date the expense was incurred. This was done in order to keep our accounting and budget analysis as up to date as possible. Late reimbursement requests will have to be submitted to the board for individual consideration.

Because our yearly budget is now over five thousand dollars we will be required to make more detailed financial filings with the IRS. All chapters will now have to submit a balance sheet or yearly budget to the National office so the required IRS form can be completed.

If you would like a copy of the National budget send a self addressed envelope to the treasurer at the National office. Cash on hand at the time of the meeting was one thousand five hundred and sixty dollars.

Membership reports that renewals for ninety three are in pace with the renewal rates of previous years. All members are reminded that this is the last issue of the Renaissance News that they will receive if they do not renew for ninety three.

The January issue of the Renaissance News was mailed a bit later than usual. Subsequent issues are expected to be mailed on or before the first of each month. Experience indicates that some members receive the Newsletter within three to five days after mailing while others have reported getting their issues as long as three weeks after mailing.

Our Editor in chief, Angela Gardner reminds all those interested in submitting articles for the newsletter to please submit the ideas first, before sending in the written article. Angela will let you know when she will need the article or if someone else is writing a piece on the same subject. Please submit your ideas to: Angela Gardner c/o Renaissance News, PO Box 530, Bensalem, PA 19020. The publishing deadline for each issue is the sixteenth of the preceding month. (March sixteenth for the April News, etc.)

Other items discussed by the board included a review of the January second planning meeting. (Over fifty items were discussed at that meeting and twenty eight were singled out as items to be pursued in the immediate future. Watch the newsletter for further details.)

The board will investigate the possibility of tax exempt purchasing based on our non-profit status.

Kelly Harris offered her resignation as an at large member of the board due to her inability to attend meetings. The board accepted her resignation and the Managing Director will be sending Kelly a letter of thanks for all of her work on behalf of the organization.

Michelle Lynn was given an at large position on the board in recognition of her service to Renaissance.

The next Renaissance National Board meeting is scheduled for Saturday, April tenth, at one PM. Any member wishing to attend is welcome. Check with your Chapter Leader or a National Board member for details.

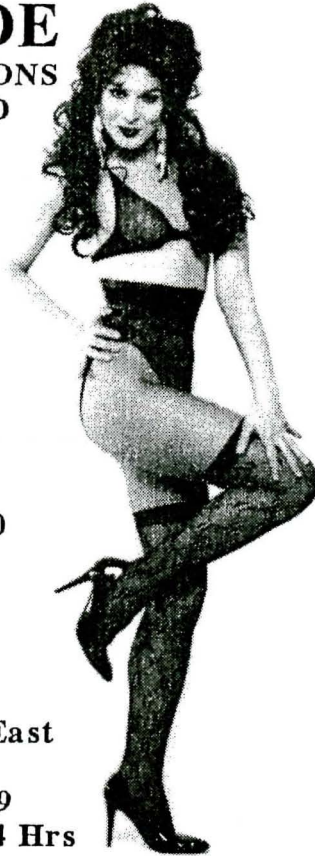
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The Inner Demands of Crossdressing

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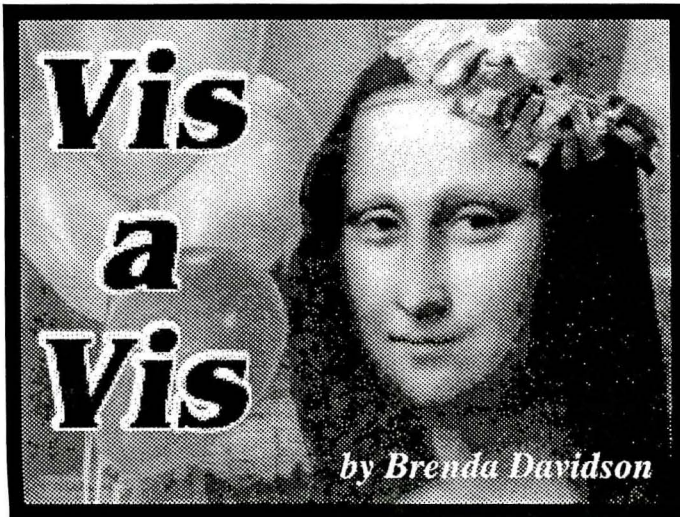
