HELPFUL HINTS

Simple Ways to Remove Cosmetic Stains From Your Washable Clothes

Removing cosmetic stains from washable clothing can be a simple task if you follow a few commonsense rules, says the Soap and Detergent Assn. The association offered these tips:

- Non-greasy cosmetic stains (powdered makeup, eye shadow, blusher): Dampen the stained area, rub with bar soap or liquid detergent, rinse and launder.

- Oily cosmetic stains (lip-

stick, rouge, liquid makeup, mascara): Treat stained area with a prewash soil and stain remover, rinse and launder.

Or, place stain facedown on a paper towel and sponge back of stain with a dry cleaning solvent.

Move fabric to a clean paper towel and repeat to take out

more of the color. When stain is removed, dampen fabric with water, rub with bar soap or detergent, rinse and launder.

- Give all stains prompt attention since they respond to treatment more readily when they're fresh.
